



PASTOR'S NOTE

Dear Saints.

We meet up with John the Baptist again in this week's Gospel, and what a privilege: he's a friend worth knowing well. John was nothing if not an Advent person, just as we are Advent people. We long with expectation for something this world cannot give, and this season is an ideal time to

give expression to that longing.

Have you ever come to church for confession and, seeing how long the line is, feared that time might run out before you're able to be heard? It causes a genuine ache within our hearts, to be so close to forgiveness yet perhaps find it beyond our grasp. That ache is a good thing - it signifies our desperation to be united with Jesus - and Advent is the time to give ourselves over to it.

John's life was marked by a message of more. Not "more" the way the world defines it: more money, more comfort, more me. John meant more Jesus, and he stirs within our hearts that same yearning. Let's spend the final week of Advent looking for satisfaction in the one place we'll find it.

WHEN THE STUDY OF SCIENCE IS SWEET

It is fascinating to see the way the study of science develops in our students. In the younger grades, science is an invitation to wonder, to nurture curiosity, and to explore their five senses. As our students get older, they begin to cultivate observation skills, learning to organize information so that it can be more easily retained and accessed. Their innate curiosity and developed skills intersect when they can engage in creative and exciting hands-on experiences of science-in-action.

Under the guidance of science teacher Dr. Eric Vollero, our middle school students took their knowledge of chemistry in a delicious direction: candy-making. They quickly realized the importance of the chemical processes they had learned; there were no short cuts and they had to be patient as the simple ingredients of corn syrup, sugar, and water went through stages of transformation when exposed to heat. Their careful attention was rewarded as they saw the candy begin to take shape. When their mixture reached the desired consistency, they flavored and colored it, pulling and twisting it into the final product. It was an exercise in close observation and teamwork with an especially sweet outcome!

As with any experiment, the real test comes when one tries to duplicate the results. Some of our students were so excited by the experience that they made the candy again at home over the weekend. They amazed family and friends with their abilities, and with the tasty and beautiful candy they were able to make on their own! It was a testimony not only to the impression the class had on them, but also to their own attentiveness and the desire to share what they had learned with those around them.


